Mitigation for Tribal Governments course (L0582)

Course Purpose: To give Tribal governments a foundation for reducing or preventing potential losses from natural or other hazards.

This 4-day course provides tribal representatives with an understanding of mitigation opportunities and techniques, the mitigation planning process, examples of mitigation success stories to reduce future losses from natural or other hazards, and an overview of available FEMA Mitigation programs and requirements for those FEMA programs.

Primary emphasis is on helping tribal emergency managers and planners identify mitigation planning requirements and identifying mitigation opportunities to protect their members and communities.

Any tribe interested in exercising the 2013 amendment to the Stafford Act to request a disaster declaration directly from the White House will need to have a FEMA-approved Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan in place. This course will teach you how to develop your Hazard Mitigation Plan.

AUDIENCE: tribal community response personnel, tribal emergency managers, tribal planners, and tribal leaders.

NOTE: Completion of E/L580 is a mandatory prerequisite

Students completing the course receive an EMI Certificate of Completion for 2.4 CEUs in the mail after the course is completed. The training and materials are free.
